Director's Notes

At the beginning of this process I looked down at the notes I had taken during our first read and at the top of the page was scrawled in barely recognizable cursive: "Andy is Bike". I joked to the group that that was going to be what I submitted as my Director's Notes. Just one sentence: Maybe handwritten on a soiled napkin. "Andy is Bike".

This became a running joke during our rehearsal days (I do love a jovial, joke-filled room as well as a good teasing) but the more I kept repeating this mantra the more I delved into the reflection of what it means to become one with our bicycles or other vehicles that help us move through the world (for myself I reflect on my prosthetic leg as the vehicle that moves me through life as my main vehicle).

In *Cycle*, Andy is bike and we get to watch him delve into the traffic of life and we invite you to literally join him on his journey (please try out experiencing the show from a bike if that's your jam!). This is also a love letter to Edmonton and what it means to move around a city and whose "right" it is to move through these city streets. Sound Designer



Stage Manager


