Thou Art Here Theatre has been around since 2011 and the seed of this show started in 2016. This territory is the traditional gathering place of many Indigenous peoples including the nêhiyawak (Cree), Saulteaux, Métis, Papaschase, Stoney, Nakota Sioux, and many more. We honour and respect the history, traditions, and culture of First Nations, Métis, and Inuit who have cared for this land and called it home. On behalf of Thou Art Here, we want to acknowledge our treaty obligations and our commitment to working together in peace and friendship with the community.

One of the core values of Thou Art Here is collaboration.

Collaboration can be seen and felt from Neil and Josh's friendship, to the creative team's camaraderie, the community building through support from Common Ground Arts, Nextfest Arts, Rubaboo Arts Festival, Flying Canoe Volant Festival, Victoria School for the Performing Arts, Fort Edmonton Park, and the dozens (hundreds?) of artists and community members who have provided insight and value to this process, performance and experience. This collaboration extends to the local, provincial, and national support and feedback we have received from our funders the Edmonton Arts Council, the Alberta Foundation for the Arts and the Canada Council for the Arts.

PLAYWRIGHT'S NOTES

Truth and Reconciliation. What does it REALLY mean? Where are we on our journey towards healing the wounds of the past? To stop the ongoing harm of the present? And to create the best future possible so Indigenous teachings can live on? Not easy questions to answer, yet in this play, I feel we have found some sort of answer. While it is not my job to tell you as the playwright, I can share with you what this project has meant to me and what I feel it means for the future. This play really began as a casual conversation. A vision that Neil shared with me. We saw a sharing of gifts we could have together. Neil had the vision, and I would offer the words. However, not unlike the signing of the treaty, that sharing of gifts changed along the way. This was no longer just "his vision, my words." This play became an eye-to-eye sharing of ideas, offers, and conversations. We shared. Compromised. Learned. Grew. And found consensus between our sharings every step of the way. To me, THAT is reconciliation. Together, we made an agreement on a vision. We went on a journey. Not only does the content of this play provide some thoughts around reconciliation, I firmly believe the process can offer all of us just as much. That is my sharing and my offering to all of you. — Josh

DIRECTORS' NOTES

As an audience member, you've intentionally been separated from others and have not seen the entire story. There's no way you can know everything that happened today. We hope that you find a chance to speak with someone during the community gathering who saw the alternate track of the show - the other side of history – the story you perhaps saw a piece of, but don't understand out of context. This is the duality of the show that has permeated the entire process – how do we recognize and value experiences out of our context?

Directing a full production of Civil Blood at Fort Edmonton Park is nothing short of surreal. About 8 years ago, a rag-tag bunch of theatre artists who also worked at Fort Edmonton Park, booked a meeting with our bosses to pitch the idea of a theatre show at the park. The executives were so lovely and polite to us, and informed us of the long road ahead to produce a show of the caliber in our imaginations. Fast forward to today, and the dream has come true – and proudly – all of those rag-tag kids who were at that meeting are STILL actively connected to the production.

We have learned a lot since this dream began. Some practical lessons, some cultural, and many more personal ones. The biggest lesson is that we will always have more to learn from each other and that everyone has a teaching to offer. — Mark & Neil

JOSH LANGUEDOC Co-Creator/Playwright

Josh is a proud member of Saugeen First Nation and lives as a guest in Treaty 6 Territory as an Anishinaabe playwright, producer, storyteller, and teacher. Since 2018, Josh has been touring his solo performance *Rocko and Nakota: Tales From the Land* to theatres and festivals all across Turtle Island. Some of Josh's other plays include *Feast* (Gwaandak Theatre 2023, NewWorks and Fringe 2022), *The Eyes Of Spirits* (Native Earth Performing Arts), and *IN-COR-RI-GI-BLE: The Legend of Thundervoice* (Blyth Festival). Josh also teaches around the Edmonton area with the Citadel's Foote Theatre

School, Edmonton Public Schools, Artstrek, Northern Alberta YMCA, and runs the teen playwriting program #WritesOfPassage at Workshop West Playwrights' Theatre. As a producer, Josh has curated the pêhonân Series (Fringe Theatre), the Indigenous Pavilion (Silver Skate Festival), Connections//Collisons (Mile Zero Dance), and #ReconcileThis (National Arts Centre Indigenous Theatre). You may have also seen Josh dawn a leather jacket as Sonny Boy in the Indigenous hit *Bear Grease* (LightningCloud Productions). Josh recently finished his MFA Theatre Practice with a focus on Indigenous Playwriting, where he is officially the third Indigenous person to ever finish this program.

atre & Pemmican Collective Creatives' Cohort and through Catalyst Theatre's Confluence Artistic Fellowship.




KATELYN CABALO Emerging Artist Producer
